It also included the design, fabrication, and installation of all of the miscellaneous items and fixtures needed to support the above equipment.

He organized this team applying skills both learned in school and skills developed as part of his personal development. He developed both cost and labor schedules that the team worked to. He managed the budget relative to labor and non-labor charging, always with the goal of being on target with both (which he did). Both of these demonstrated his ability to manage a project. Overall, the budget for this effort was \$96.2K.

During this work he communicated regularly with me regarding the status of the work, issues needing resolution, and basic information necessary for feedback to my customers. He led with a positive attitude and demonstrated industry to the team by his own high work ethic and engineering capabilities. He maintained a good rapport with each team member, allowing them the opportunity to succeed in their assignments and providing help when there were issues or challenges.

His (their) work culminated in successful presentations and demonstrations to both ISU and INL Stakeholders. For their work, this team took second place in an ASME student competition and received the ISU "Best Senior Engineering Project Award" from the ISU Engineering Department. They also received praise from INL managers and observers.

To Whom It May Concern:

The Information Services department of the City of Twin Falls was fortunate to manage Mr. Cody Race, a summer intern, engaged by the city for GIS data acquisition, between the dates of June 6th and August 17th, 2007. City Engineer Jackie Fields provided the project funding and focus.

Mr. Race actually worked six weeks of that total eight week period of time. During which he documented by GPS the following:

5,000 Street Signs. 2,428 Building Outlines. 2,288 Handicap Ramps. 1,458 Street Lights. 50 Crosswalks.

11,224 total objects.

Mr. Race was assigned an eight hour day, 8:00 a.m. to 5 p.m. with a one hour lunch break. He used a handheld GPS unit to gather data on the above objects. He additionally acquired roadway speeds from existing speed limit signs and applied them to 3,376 road segments within our GIS. While verifying the street signs, he documented that, of the previous total, 180 were incorrectly signed.

It should be noted that Mr. Race was 15 years of age when he performed this work, with direction, but no field supervision. I personally considered this quite remarkable and far superior to the earlier output of two previous college student interns initially hired for the same project, but who found the task too menial, solitary and the conditions too difficult (hot) for their preferences, and subsequently quit. Under similar but even more sever environmental conditions, Mr. Race not only subsisted, but demonstrated a willingness to succeed, and volunteered to expand his initial instructions and gathered far more data than had been proposed or expected.

I would employ Mr. Race anytime, solely for his attitude, saying nothing of his obvious abilities.
